February 20, 2018

**CALL TO ORDER**

The regular meeting for the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Michael Seibert.

**PRESENTATIONS**

Rob O'Brian, President of Joplin Area Chamber of Commerce presented the quarterly update. One specific item Rob spoke on was how to bring more talent to our employer community. He stated Joplin has a continually growing employer base with a need to fill positions. After analyzing this situation and working with people in the community, particularly our veterans, we focused in on the fact that there is great talent within the military community, both veterans and people who are transitioning out of active service. Rob stated he has been working with organizations such as Compass Quest, True North and Joining Community Forces and a number of local organizations to roll out a program called Welcome Home to Joplin. It's a way to raise awareness that Joplin is a great place to live and work. The program will be a six-month trail campaign beginning in late March 2018. This week the City will host open house public meetings for two upcoming neighborhood projects in the recovery area.
