

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
MEETING MINUTES**

March 19, 2018

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting for the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Michael Seibert.

INVOCATION - read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE to the United States of America was led by Mr. Shaw.

ROLL CALL – Answering Roll Call were Taylor Brown, Melodee Colbert-Kean, Dan McCreary, Michael Seibert, Gary Shaw; Ryan Stanley, Phil Stinnett, and Jim West. Also in attendance were City Manager Sam Anselm and City Attorney Peter Edwards. Absent: Miranda Lewis. Motion by Mr. Shaw, second by Mr. West to excuse Mrs. Lewis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, McCreary, Seibert, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 8. Nays:0.

PRESENTATIONS

Becky Zimmerman, a consultant with Design Workshop in Aspen, CO, presented the final report and recommendations to the city council on the Independent Tourism Study. Her recommendations were to improve visitor experiences, increase the number of visitors, capture visitor spending and emphasize results-driven tourism marketing. She highly recommended developing a conference center with a hotel that will bring the most number of people to Joplin on a consistent basis, and it has an opportunity to benefit all of the hotel properties and the restaurants and the retail markets, which will spread the economic impact through all of Joplin's business sectors. At the end of the presentation, the city council decided to implement the Next Steps as outlined by Ms. Zimmerman. Next Steps: the CVB should decide which recommendations are priorities and discuss with City Council; collect visitor data, undertake identity and branding study and increase lodging tax for new conference facility. Mr. Stinnett asked that a timeline be established to include periodic updates from CVB Director Patrick Tuttle to keep the council updated and informed of the progress and direction of the next steps.

FINALIZATION OF CONSENT AGENDA –There being no further business to come before the Council, the Consent Agenda was finalized.

Joplin Parks and Rec Department has added a twist to the traditional egg hunt... hunting in the DARK! Children ages 3-10 are invited to the Flashlight Easter Egg Hunt this Saturday, March 24. Over 10,000 eggs will be scattered on four softball fields at the Joplin Athletic Complex with different ages hunting on different fields. Children will need to bring a flashlight and container to collect eggs. There is a \$3 per child entry fee and pre-registration is required by Thursday, March 22. The Department has also partnered with the Joplin Association for the Blind to add another hunt that Blind, Visually Impaired and Handicapped children ages 3-10 can join the fun. The hunt will feature "beeper eggs" along with candy and toy filled eggs. This hunt is free for those eligible to register, with the Association covering the registration fee.

Parks and Rec have hit an all-time high with their soccer registration – but there's still room for your child to join the Youth Developmental Soccer program. Kids are grouped according to their age, with teams playing a 6-game regular season schedule. Cost is \$40, and players receive a mesh jersey, shorts, socks and soccer ball. 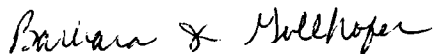
