

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
JUNE 3, 2019 MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

INVOCATION was read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE to the United States of America was led by Dr. Reid Adams.

ROLL CALL

Answering Roll Call were Council Members: Melodee Colbert-Kean, Keenan Cortez, Doug Lawson, Anthony Monteleone, Diane Reid Adams, Gary Shaw, Ryan Stanley, and Phil Stinnett. Also, in attendance were Interim City Manager Dan Pekarek and City Attorney Peter Edwards. Absent: Taylor Brown. Motion by Mrs. Colbert-Kean, second by Mr. Monteleone to excuse Taylor Brown. Voting in favor were Council Members: Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 8. Nays: 0.

PRESENTATIONS

Clifford Wert presented an update on Connect2Culture and Spiva Center for the Arts. He stated 192 donors comprised of individuals, businesses, foundations and groups have committed \$14,658,216.00 toward the Harry M. Cornell Arts and Entertainment Complex, satisfying the conditions as set out in the City's MOU in October 2017. Letters of intent to proceed have been signed by Connect2Culture and Spiva Center for the Arts with the architects DLR Group of New York City and Corner Greer & Associates of Joplin, and Crossland Construction Company as the construction manager. The plan is to move forward with design development, leading to construction documents and bidding. The ultimate plan is to begin construction in late 2020 with completion in mid-2022. They will continue their pursuit of the \$16 million dollars goal as the architectural and structural work proceeds. Earlier today, a crowdfunding effort with the goal of \$5,000 was announced. Any amount of donation is appreciated. Mr. Wert showed a video of people expressing support of the entertainment complex, then thanked the Council, staff and everyone involved in this endeavor.

Presentation and Update of the Joplin Youth Council and confirmation of the appointments: Taylor Cunningham, Assistant to the City Manager, gave a brief review of the JYC background, purpose, recruitment and selection process, and the appointments. After the update, she introduced the high school students who were selected for the council: Audrey Wheeler-McAuley; Kambrea Manning - College Heights; Riley Peterson-College Heights; Dillon Dodge-Thomas Jefferson; Jane Min-Thomas Jefferson; Rosalyn Jourdan-Joplin; Cora Wesley-Joplin; Jake Saunders-Joplin; Chloe Bonds-Joplin; Spencer Vreeland-Joplin; Julian Garrett-Joplin (absent). Motion by Mrs. Colbert Kean, second by Mr. Stanley to approve the slate candidates as presented. Voting in favor were Council Members: Colbert-Kean, Cortez, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley and Stinnett, 8. Nays: 0. Absent: Brown: 1.

News from the Public Information Officer, Lynn Onstot

Some NEW road projects in Joplin started today, including work from the City as well as the Missouri Department of Transportation.

Micro-surfacing of streets has begun and includes the area of “F” Street to 16th Street from Main Street to Maiden Lane. Streets are selected based on the pavement’s condition. A map is posted on the City’s website for reference.

Residents living on affected streets will be notified with an informational door hanger on their front doors 48 hours prior to the work. No parking signs will also be posted along both sides of the street. Vehicles should not park on posted streets until the surfacing work has been completed. Missouri Department of Transportation will be working along east 32nd Street starting today. Improvements to three intersections will be done at Main Street, Indiana Avenue and Connecticut Avenue.

Contractor crews will work nighttime hours between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m., Sunday through Friday, beginning at Main Street and working east. At least one lane in each direction will be open to traffic where crews are working. All lanes on 32nd Street will be open to traffic during daytime hours. The intersection improvements are a 50/50 cost-share with the City of Joplin. Following intersection improvements, contractor crews will remove the current driving surface on 32nd Street and replace it with a new asphalt surface between Main Street and Route 249. Work is scheduled to be completed by July 2020, weather permitting.

If the weather has caused a few tree limbs to fall – don't forget about the FREE limb drop off the City offers on the 3rd Saturday each month. On June 15, bring your limbs out to 1702 North Schifferdecker Avenue, from 8 – 2 p.m. And after you drop off your limbs – get some FREE Wood Chips before you leave! These will be offered every 3rd Saturday at this same location, as supplies allow. **Citizens should bring their truck, trailer and/or containers and City Staff will load these chips for you!**

Mrs. Colbert-Kean asked if city staff can look into getting the clumps of asphalt removed that are left behind by the micro surfacing projects. Staff will look into it.

Comments from Council:

Dr. Reid Adams stated she had a call from a citizen concerning the recent power outage at the new airport terminal, but the old terminal still had power. She asked about a generator back-up. Assistant PW Director of Operations Lynden Lawson stated the generators are for the runways; we currently do not have a generator back-up for the terminal. Dr. Reid Adams asked if it was possible to switch the generator at the old terminal to the new terminal. Mr. Lawson stated the terminals are on different lines. Mayor Shaw asked if staff could look into the issue and come up with possible solutions. Mr. Lawson replied there has been discussion to research the cost of a generator at the new terminal.

Mr. Stinnett suggested that perhaps the generator at Memorial Hall could be transferred to the airport. Mr. Stinnett agreed with Allen Shirley's comment that the museum is a crown jewel in Joplin. He commended Mr. Shirley for putting so much personal time and effort into the remarkable exhibits at the museum.

Mr. Cortez stated he will be attending the Newly Elected Officials training at the MML Conference in Columbia, MO June 6-7.

Mr. Monteleone asked for an update on the RFP process for the city manager search company. City Attorney Edwards replied the deadline for receiving proposals is June 5, and Council will be receiving a packet on Thursday with the proposals. The Council agreed to discuss the proposals at the June 17 council meeting.

Mayor Shaw stated Kansas City University of Medicine and Biosciences will make a special announcement tomorrow.

Mayor Shaw stated he had the opportunity throw out the first pitch at the Joplin Outlaws baseball game at Joe Becker Stadium on Friday, May 31. He was very pleased to see a full parking lot and many volunteers and fans at the game. He thanked Mark Raines for bringing baseball to Joplin and thanked all those who help with housing the players.

Mayor Shaw stated he had the opportunity to meet with officials from Harris County, TX while they were visiting Joplin to study the process of how Joplin recovered from the 2011 tornado. Harris County was affected by Hurricane Harvey and they are beginning the recovery process. Mayor Shaw stated the Harris County officials were thankful for the generosity, hospitality and graciousness of the city staff. Mayor Shaw stated the time spent with the officials were some of the most enjoyable times he's had since being on the council in 18 years. He stated he's very proud of the city staff and Guidehouse for all they have done for our city.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:49.
