

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
AUGUST 6, 2018 MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting for the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

Mayor Shaw asked for a moment of silence to honor Officer David Brewer and his wife Stacy who were recently killed in a vehicle accident.

INVOCATION read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE to the United States of America was led by Mr. West.

ROLL CALL – Answering Roll Call were Melodee Colbert-Kean, Doug Lawson, Anthony Monteleone, Diane Reid Adams, Gary Shaw; Ryan Stanley, Phil Stinnett, and Jim West. Also, in attendance were City Manager Sam Anselm and City Attorney Peter Edwards. Absent: Taylor Brown. Motion by Mrs. Colbert-Kean, second by Mr. Monteleone to excuse Mr. Brown. Voting in favor were Council Members: Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett and West, 8. Nays: 0.

PRESENTATIONS

Mayor Shaw presented a proclamation to Aaron Garcia to proclaim August 15, 2018 as United at the Stadium Day, which tries to heighten suicide prevention and awareness for Joplin and the surrounding area.
