

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
SEPTEMBER 4, 2018 MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting for the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

INVOCATION read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

Joplin Parks and Recreation staff recently completed an update to Leonard Park's playground

for our younger citizens to enjoy. Other updates are coming soon also – The basketball court at Cunningham park will be redone; Landreth Park tennis courts are being repaired and reconfigured for 6 Pickle Ball Courts – Joplin’s newest recreational offering; and the tennis court at Leonard Park is being repaired and repainted for tennis enthusiasts.

Joplin Public Library recently introduced **hoopla**, a brand new, revolutionary library lending service! Patrons can now borrow thousands of videos and music albums right from a smartphone, tablet or web browser. This easy-to-use digital lending platform is available to all Joplin Public Library patrons using web browsers or Apple devices. **hoopla** is a program that allows Joplin Public Library patrons to use their library account to electronically borrow movies, TV episodes and music albums and access them from any compatible device. Using cloud computing, patrons can borrow titles using a home computer, begin watching on a tablet, and resume using a smartphone – anywhere there’s an Internet connection! With mobile devices, **hoopla** allows you to take the library with you wherever you go!

The City has two more months of free limb drop off opportunities. Offered on the third Saturday of the month, residents can bring limbs out on September 15 and October 20.
