

**JOPLIN CITY COUNCIL
OCTOBER 15, 2018 MEETING MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting for the Joplin City Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Gary Shaw.

INVOCATION read by City Clerk Barbara Gollhofer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE to the United States of America was led by Mrs. Colbert-Kean.

ROLL CALL – Answering Roll Call were Council Members: Taylor Brown, Melodee Colbert-Kean, Doug Lawson, Anthony Monteleone, Diane Reid Adams, Gary Shaw, Ryan Stanley, Phil Stinnett and Jim West. Also, in attendance were City Manager Sam Anselm and City Attorney Peter Edwards.

PRESENTATIONS

Mayor Shaw presented a proclamation proclaiming October as Energy Awareness Month and October 30, 2018 as Weatherization Day to Ryan Peterson, who accepted it on behalf of Economic Security. Mr. Peterson thanked everyone for their support and stated there will be a demonstration on weatherization on October 30 for anyone who is interested in this process.

Taylor Cunningham, Assistant to the City Manager, gave an update on the formation of the Joplin Youth Council. Ms. Cunningham explained that a youth council is an advisory to the city council and is made up of high school students from local private and public schools. It offers leadership training and civic engagement to help plan and implement community initiatives, to possibly help work through local issues. Benefits of a youth council include communicating their concerns regarding local issues; directly participate in local government and make decisions and take actions to positively impact their community. This would hopefully create an investment into the community in which they would want to stay or come back to. The benefits to the City Council would be: the youth would be more representative of the community of their age group; get more insight of the community's perspective from a younger perspective; improve services that impact young people; and encourage youths to be more engaged (invested) in the political process. The steps to implementation of a youth council are: 1) create an ordinance or resolution to establish the council as an advisory group to the city council, and create rules and bylaws; 2) invest in a youth council (currently seeking private funding); 3) connect, publicize and recruit at the local schools; 4) select council members by the preliminary target date of May 2019 so that the council will be ready to begin in September. Taylor gave a timeline for key dates, starting with adopting an ordinance and bylaws in December; February: visit schools and promote interest; March, applications are open; May: select JYC members for the 2019-2020 school year; June & July: summer mixers and activities; August: meet with city council members; September: first formal meeting. It was the consensus of the City Council to move forward with this project.

FINALIZATION OF CONSENT AGENDA

There being no further business to come before the Council, the Consent Agenda was finalized.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Planning and Community Development Director Troy Bolander gave an update on the Joplin Bungalows. Director Bolander introduced John Joines, CEO of Economic Security Corporation and Bruce Adib-Yazdi from the Vecino Group. Mr. Joines explained the reasons for the delay of this project were due to additional costs of having to pay prevailing wage (when it was first thought we wouldn't have to) and a substantial increase in material costs. This caused the groups to go back over the project and identify every single item in the budget/proforma, which resulted in a smaller complex with 20 units being built instead of the original 32. Upon the council's approval of the adjusted number of units, City staff will prepare a council bill for the November 5 City Council meeting. Construction will start the first of November with the expected completion date to be September 2019. Mr. Adib-Yazdi expanded on some of the changes to the units that resulted from the review of the project. Motion by Mr. West, second by Mrs. Colbert-Kean to move forward with this project. Voting in favor were Council Members: Brown, Colbert-Kean, Lawson, Monteleone, Reid Adams, Shaw, Stanley, Stinnett, and West, 9. Nays: 0.

Discussion of the Public Safety Sales Tax Projections by Finance Director Leslie Haase. Director Haase reviewed the 10-year projections report that was distributed to the city council. The report showed the revenues and expenditures and the net change in fund balance.

News from the Public Information Office

Taylor Cunningham, Assistant to the City Manager, read the following news items:

4th street is closed at Murphy Blvd. for repairs to railroad crossing. city is working with Kansas City Southern to make these improvements which are paid for through Capital Improvements Sales Tax. Work will be done by end of Friday October 26, weather permitting.

Drivers will experience lane shifts on two areas of 20th street starting Thursday this week as projects near completion with paving. Milling and paving Range Line to Murphy Blvd. should be completed by Tuesday October 23 weather permitting.

Work on Inside lanes of 20th from Indiana to Main St. Will also cause lane shifts. These are being redone to correct a smoothness issue that occurred during the initial paving and is being corrected by the contractor as part of their quality control program, with no additional cost to the City of Joplin.

Work will continue Saturday, Oct. 20 and if needed on Sunday, Oct. 21 until this section is completed. Work in this area is being done over the weekend to prevent disruptions with Joplin High School.

Parks and Recreation Department will host their annual **Old-Fashioned Hayride** at 7 p.m. on Friday, October 19 at McClelland Park. The event is completely free to the public. Tractor-drawn hayrides will take visitors through the park. The department will be handing out 1,000 hot dogs and s'mores to roast over campfires scattered around the park. Attendees are encouraged to bring roasting sticks to have a weenie roast around the campfires. The movie, *Coco*, will be shown during the event.

Comments from City Council:

Mr. Brown replied that he had contacted the city attorney and city manager and learned that the exact charge was to find general revenue streams for all city employees and not just police and fire employees.

Mrs. Colbert-Kean informed the city council that she will be attending the National League of Cities conference in Los Angeles, CA November 5-11, 2015. Most of her expenses are paid by NLC except for her meals. Motion by Mr. Stanley, second by Mr. West to approve the request for per diem for November 5-11, 2018.
