Joplin Police Department Receives Advanced Accreditation

The Joplin Police Department is pleased to announce that it has received the Advanced Accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies. In April 2014 a team of CALEA assessors came to the Joplin Police Department to conduct an on-site assessment of the police department. The assessors also spoke with members of the public about the police department.
