News from the Public Information Office

The City's Tree Limb and Brush Drop Off starts next month. The City will open the tree limb and brush drop-off site every third Friday and Saturday, with Friday, March 18 and Saturday, March 19 being the first dates. The site is open from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. on both days.

The program is open the third Friday and Saturday of each month from March through October, unless there is a weather event that warrants another date being set. The drop-off site is located at 1702 North Schifferdecker Avenue, just six tenths of a mile north of Belle Center Road on the west side of Schifferdecker.

The National Weather Service in Springfield, Missouri will be offering four Virtual Storm Spotter Training times in upcoming weeks. The virtual training sessions are entirely free and open to new and seasoned spotters alike. The times are 7 to 8 p.m. on March 17; 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. on March 19; 1 to 2 p.m. on April 5 and 7 to 8 p.m. on April 12.

Interested persons can go to weather.gov/sgf/SkywarnSpotter for more information and to register for a date and time that works best for their schedules. If these times are not convenient, a recording will be available on Springfield's National Weather Service's Youtube page.

Residents can view various websites to learn what programs, and such are planned in upcoming weeks and months. These next few cold wintery days may be a good time to explore these virtually.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-501

Mr. Lawson introduced Council Bill No. 2022-501 - AN ORDINANCE amending the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 as adopted by Ordinance 2020-156 on October 19, 2020, to adjust appropriations and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Lawson, second by Mr. Shaw that Council Bill No. 2022-501 be passed on an emergency basis. Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2022-502 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Contract by and between the City of Joplin and Segal to update the City's Rules and Regulations Manual; authorizing the City Manager to execute said Contract by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Monteleone, second by Mr. Cortez that Council Bill No. 2022-503 be passed on an emergency basis. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-021**.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-602

Mr. Cortez introduced Council Bill No. 2022-602 - AN ORDINANCE approving a contract for grant money by and between the City of Joplin, Missouri and the Missouri Department of Transportation dealing generally with the Full Time DWI Unit, Hazardous Moving Violations Enforcement, and DWI Enforcement in the amount of Ninety-Three Thousand, Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$93,250.00); authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin, Missouri; and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. Copple that Council Bill No. 2022-602 be passed on an emergency basis. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. Lawson to pass Council Bill No. 2022-109 on First Reading and advance to Second and Third Reading. Mr. Monteleone discussed the CAPS program.


Mr. Stinnett is interested in seeing the survey of downtown businesses regarding parklets.
