PUBLIC HEARING FOR COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-282

Mr. Cople introduced Council Bill No. 2022-282- AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 2022-274, passed by the Council of the City of Joplin, Missouri, August 1, 2022, by removing from District C-1-PD (Neighborhood Commercial Planned Development) and including in District C-O (Neighborhood Office) property as described below and located at 1234 N. Duquesne Rd., City of Joplin, Jasper County, Missouri. Motion by Mr. Cople, second by Ms. Williams that Council Bill No. 2022-282 be placed on First Reading and passed.

Minutes of the September 19, 2022, City Council Meeting

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-281 - AN ORDINANCE approving an Agreement between the City of Joplin, Missouri, and Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission which will provide FHWA Metropolitan Planning Assistance and FTA Section 5303 assistance, hereafter known as Consolidated Planning Funds, from November 1, 2020, through October 31, 2021, in accordance with the rules of the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) under 49 U.S.C. Section 5303 and 23 U.S. Code Sections 104(F) and 134 to conduct comprehensive and transportation planning programs, as the City of Joplin has been designated to conduct transportation planning programs for the Joplin Area Transportation Study Organization; authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute said Agreement for the City. **Ordinance No. 2022-150.**

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-149

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2022-149 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin to enter into a construction agreement with McClanahan Construction Co. Inc., in the amount of One Million, Two Hundred Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,200,000.00) for construction services associated with the Turkey Creek Wastewater Treatment Facility Intermediate Screw Pump Replacement on behalf of the City of Joplin and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2022-149 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-151.**

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-451

Mr. Shaw introduced Council Bill No. 2022-451 - AN ORDINANCE approving a Program Services Contract by and between the State of Missouri, Department of Health and Senior Services, and the City of Joplin, Missouri, for a term commencing October 1, 2022 and running through September 30, 2023, for the amount of up to Six Hundred Eleven Thousand, Eight Hundred Thirteen Dollars and no Cents (\$611,813.00), to enable the Health Department to provide nutritional assistance and education to residents of Jasper County, authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin, Missouri: and containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Shaw, second by Dr. Farnham that Council Bill No. 2022-451 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-152.**

ORDINANCES – FIRST READING**COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-284**

Mr. Copple introduced Council Bill No. 2022-284 - AN ORDINANCE establishing grades and accepting the Final Plat of Emerald Glades Plat 1 located at 3330 & 3332 N. St. Louis Ave. in the City of Joplin, Jasper County, Missouri. Motion by Mr. Copple, second by Ms. Spencer to that Council Bill No. 2022-284 be passed on the first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-284.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-611

Mr. DeTar introduced Council Bill No. 2022-611 - AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City of Joplin, Missouri, to enter into an Agreement with Oakhurst Signs & Graphics, for the purpose of replacing wayfinding signage for the not to exceed price of Thirty-Nine Thousand Three Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$39,300.00); and authorizing the City Manager to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Joplin. Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Ms. Williams that Council Bill No. 2022-611 be passed on first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Copple, Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 9. Nays: 0. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-611.


SECOND AND THIRD READING**UNFINISHED BUSINESS**
