Third Thursday in downtown Joplin is a fun community event for the whole family. This Thursday, October 20, is the final Third Thursday of the season and it's the spookiest time of the year! Join the Zombie Walk, visit the Trunk or Treat, show off your costumes, and visit some of the most haunted spots downtown. Third Thursday is held from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Everyone is invited to enjoy local artisans, music, entertainment, and food.

Reliable Childcare is a topic of a panel discussion that will take place on Thursday, October 20. Missouri lost more than 12% of its childcare businesses since the start of the pandemic. The evening meeting will focus on how to increase the supply of childcare in the SW region of Missouri and will be held from 6:30 to 8 p.m. at the Joplin Advance Training and Technology Center at 420 Grand Avenue.

Everyone is welcome and the hosts are hoping to visit with many interested people, from policymakers, caring community members, human resource representatives, business owners and managers, childcare providers and others.

The discussion is hosted by the Missouri Dept. of Social Services, the MoKan Partnership and the Alliance of Southwest Missouri. More information can be found from these organizations.

Join Joplin Parks & Recreation at 7 pm on Friday, October 21st for their annual Old-Fashioned Hayride! This FREE event will be held at McClelland Park, located at 44th and McClelland Boulevard.

The event will feature many family-friendly activities, including a hayride, making s'mores, yard games, and a movie in the park. S'mores kits will be handed out on a first-come, first-serve basis. Guests are encouraged to bring sticks to roast their marshmallows over the bonfires. The Salvation Army will be on hand providing hot chocolate to event guests. The Halloween-themed movie, "Hocus Pocus" will be shown during the event on the Department's giant inflatable movie screen. The Creative Learning Alliance will also be on site with some fun STEAM activities for people to try out!

Governor Parson has declared Friday, Oct. 21 as Missouri Buckle Up Phone Down Day. The Joplin Health Department is working with multiple Coalitions to reduce car crashes, as it is the number one cause of deaths in teenagers.

This Friday, the State of Missouri is pushing for ZERO fatalities on roadways. One way to do this is if everyone would buckle up every time they are in the car, put their phone down, or set it to "do not disturb" while driving. Distracted driving is on the rise. Distracted driving can also include "impaired" driving due to alcohol, drugs, excessive sleepiness, and other activities people do when driving.

Assistant Police Chief Brian Lewis will be on a local television morning show tomorrow talking about these same things in conjunction with the campaign.

The Health Department staff are willing to attend events to showcase the risks involved and offer guidance and tips. They have several resources such as Parent/Teen Contracts, and other info to hand out, along with some interactive props that people have enjoyed while learning more about Buckle Up Phone Down efforts. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-160**.

Motion by Mr. DeTar, second by Ms. Williams that Council Bill No. 2022-534 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 8. Nays: 0. Absent: Copple, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-161**.

Mr. Stinnett introduced Council Bill No. 2022-536 - AN ORDINANCE adopting a new step pay plan by reference the City Salary Administration Plan; establishing the annual salary of certain Classified and Unclassified positions and Part-Time/Seasonal positions for Fiscal Year 2022-2023; and, containing an emergency clause. Motion by Mr. Stinnett, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2022-536 be passed on an emergency basis. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, DeTar, Farnham, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 8. Nays: 0. Absent: Copple, 1. The Council Bill was declared adopted and entitled **Ordinance No. 2022-162**.

COUNCIL BILL NO. 2022-613

Dr. Farnham introduced Council Bill No. 2022-613 - AN ORDINANCE approving the issuance of a Purchase Order to MacQueen Emergency to cover the purchase of two (2) Pierce Velocity replacement fire engines which has been included in the Annual Budget of the City of Joplin for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023, to adjust appropriations and containing an emergency clause. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 7. Nays: Farnham, 1. Absent: Cople, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-009.

Motion by Mr. Cortez, second by Mr. DeTar that Council Bill No. 2022-010 be passed on first reading and advance to second and third. Voting in favor were Council Members: Cortez, DeTar, Lawson, Shaw, Spencer, Stinnett, and Williams, 7. Nays: Farnham, 1. Absent: Cople, 1. The Bill was read as Council Bill No. 2022-010.


SECOND AND THIRD READING**UNFINISHED BUSINESS****NEW BUSINESS**
